The offensive team was a different story. "Our offense actually kept Glastonbury in the game. Penalties on the offensive unit hurt. The three fumbles in costly situations hurt. We had the ball on their two, but a clip set us back. We had the ball inside their 20, and another clip set us back, and another time we had a touchdown

called back because of a penalty."

The Raiders ended up with 242 total yards on the ground, while Glastonbury was held to but 80. Raider defenders actually held their opponents to an average of only 2.4 yards per carry.

"South Windsor just won their first game of the season last week, and they have been averaging 1300 paid fans a game. We average about 200. This Saturday we play our last home game of the year and it is against Newington.
