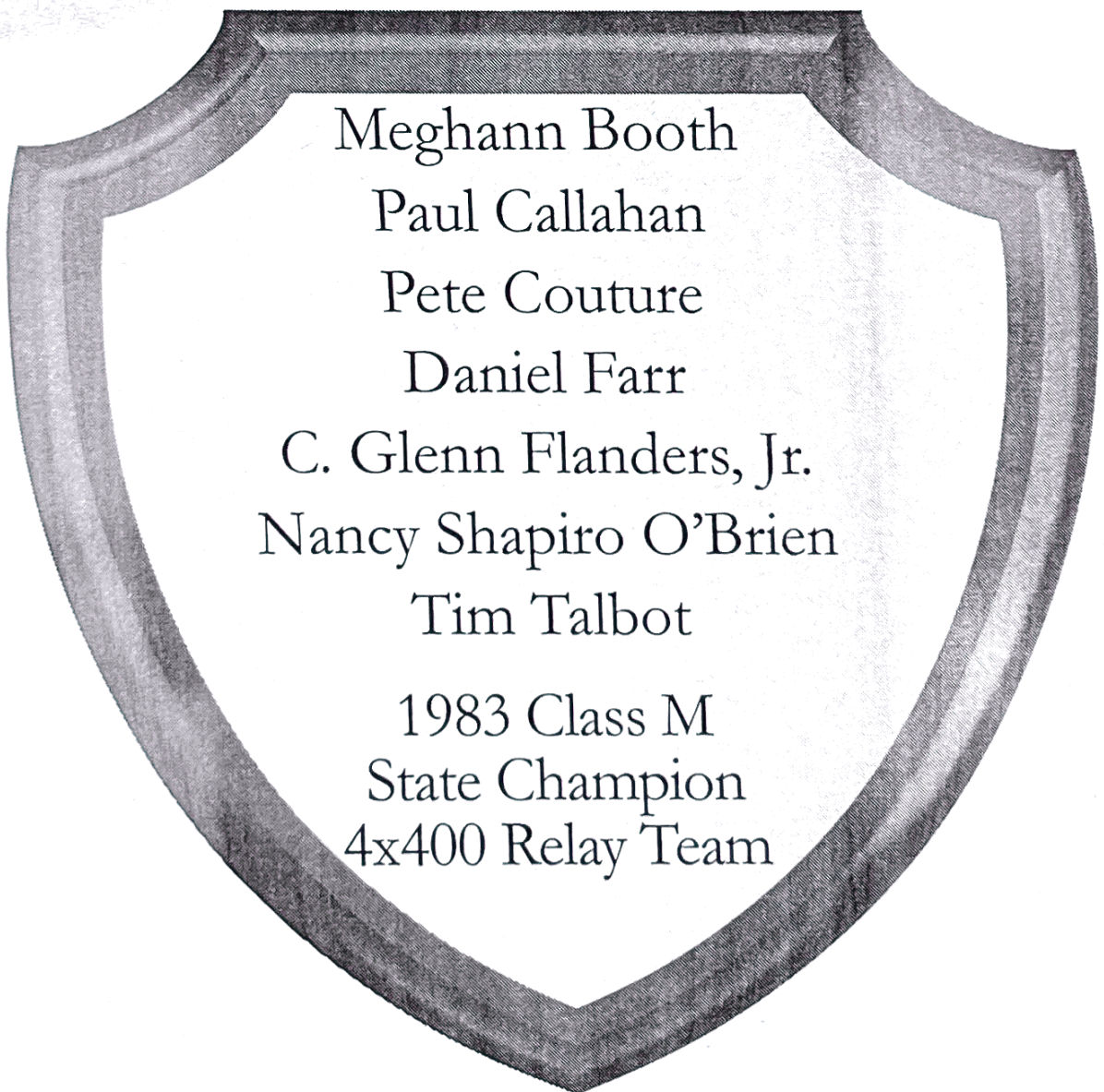

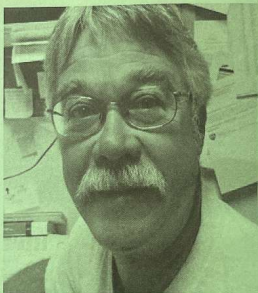

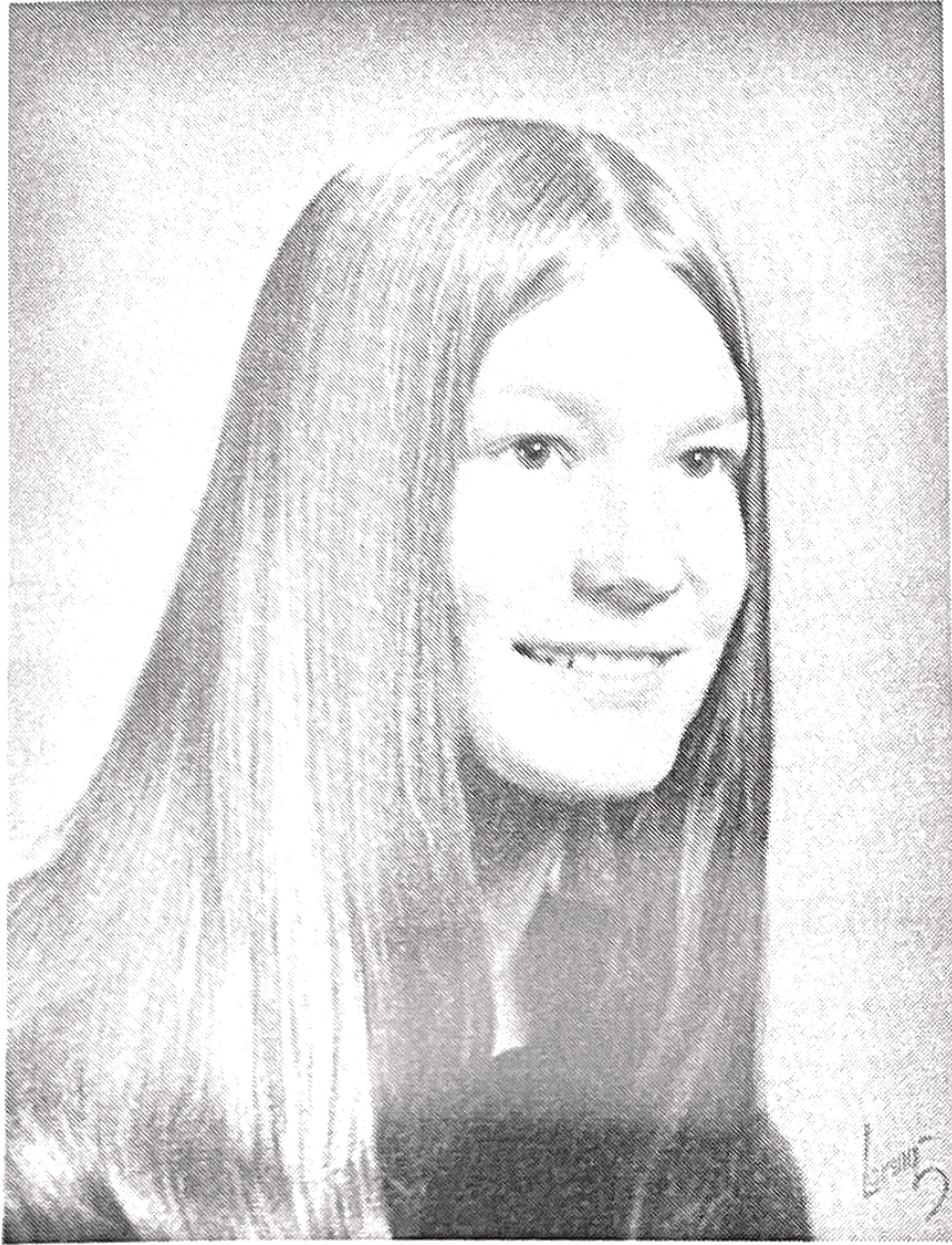

# Nancy Shapiro O'Brien



It is not easy being a member of a prominent athletic family in a small town like Windsor Locks. Nancy Shapiro O'Brien's athletic career began in the shadow of her Father Spud, her uncle Al (both Hall of Fame members) and her brother Steve. But it was not long before Nancy stepped in to the light, forging her own stellar sports legacy while leading the way for the girls coming up behind her.

Entering Windsor Locks High School while Title IX was being implemented, Nancy and her teammates were among the pioneers of women's athletics. Nancy made the best of the three sports that were available to her, playing four years of field hockey, three years of basketball and two years of softball.

With Nancy at wing the field hockey team reached the semi-finals of the state tournament in 1973. The basketball team had an amazing record of 33-2 over a two-year period. They would have done better in the state tournament if their two top players had not come down with an illness. Her senior year Nancy's scoring average was 18.1. Although at the time there were no all-state honors for women, Nancy was invited to play in the prestigious Hardware City Classic All-star game. As a pitcher on the softball team she won 7 games one season. .

Nancy went on to play basketball and softball at Springfield College before she embarked on a long career as a teacher and coach in Ellington. Nancy and her husband Tim have 2 children Andrew and Scott. Nancy worked in the Ellington School system for 44 years. She began as a PE teacher but spent the balance of her career as a career counselor. She coached Varsity Soccer, JV Basketball and softball during her time in Ellington. Her family enjoys swimming and playing pool games; pool basketball is a family favorite. Nancy's hobbies include running, walking, hiking, swimming, gardening, reading and the theater. She also enjoys going to the beach and spending time with family and friends.

# Pete Couture



Pete Couture was a respected member of the Professional Bowlers Association for 24 years, winning five PBA titles. But Pete was not finished after 24 years. Instead, he reinvented himself and went from star to super star when he joined the senior tour. Pete was the PBA50 Rookie of the Year in 1995 and in 1998 was the PBA50 Player of the Year; one of only 9 bowlers to collect both awards, all of whom are Hall of Famers. In 1995 Pete won the first of his nine PBA50 titles in Reno. He captured a pair of USBCS Senior Titles in 1998 and 2002. In addition, Pete had 5 other top 10 senior Master finishes and in a span of 20 years he had a USBC Open Championship average of 203. Growing up in New England, Pete won more than 20 state and local association titles in Maine and Connecticut. He was inducted into the Central Connecticut and Connecticut State Bowling Associations Halls of Fame in 1993 and the USBC Hall of Fame in 2004.

Pete worked at Bradley Bowl from 1972-1991. He then moved to Florida. Besides being a great bowler, he was an avid golfer for more than 50 years. Earlier in his life he also played tennis. Pete thrived on competition and loved playing pool, backgammon, and darts. He kept a competitive dart board in the back of his pro shop at Bradley Bowl and he was known to play between servicing customers. Along the way Pete earned the respect of his fellow bowlers. After Pete died PBA members Marshall Holman and Bill Spigner, remembered Pete as a great competitor and one of the toughest, hardest -working players in the sport. Pete Couture garnered Hall of Fame credentials before he turned 50; but he was only hitting his stride. Pete rose to rarefied status on the senior bowling tour. Like a fine wine he got better with age.

# C. Glenn Flanders, Jr.



Before he was a well-respected insurance broker, Chairman of the Board of education and father of four, C. Glenn Flanders Jr. collected hall of fame credentials for his athletic ability. Playing baseball and basketball in the 1940's at Windsor Locks High School and then at Brown University, Glenn excelled at both winning championships and factoring large in big games throughout his athletic career.

In the 1940's the high school seasons ran differently than they do now. The basketball team played 2 seasons, one before the State tournament and one after. Excluding the State tournament basketball teams would play 30 games. Because of the extended basketball season the baseball team would play only 12 games. Glenn played under Hall of Fame Coach Al Shapiro who turned the basketball program around during his tenure. Glenn and Coach

Al remained good friends until Glenn passed away in 1997. Glenn's junior year the Raiders basketball team snapped South Windsor's Ellsworth High's winning streak of over 50 wins. His senior year they had an outstanding team and at one point won 11 games in a row. They went on to win 2 games in the state tournament and no doubt would have won more but Glenn and the second leading scores had to sit out after contracting the mumps. Glenn averaged double figures his senior year playing the forward position.

In baseball Glenn was a 3-year starter. His junior year he hit over .400. Although primarily a shortstop, he pitched a no-hitter in high school. In the summer of 42, Glenn and his teammates won the state American Legion Tournament.

Glenn played 2 years of basketball and 3 years of baseball at Brown University; one season batting .320. His sports career at Brown was interrupted by his military service but both the Pittsburgh Pirates and Brooklyn Dodgers showed interest in him before he graduated.

After college, Glenn returned to Windsor Locks, married Dorothy Dowd and they raised their four children, John, James, C. Glenn, III and Catherine. Glenn and Cathy are prior inductees in the Hall of Fame. Glenn loved to spend time with his family on Martha's Vineyard. He was an avid golfer and a long-time member of the Suffield Country Club. He coached Senior League baseball with Hall of Fame Coach Bob O'Connor. Glenn ran a successful insurance agency in town for many years and served as chairman of the Board of Education. He played in the Hamilton baseball league and legend has it, hit 3 home runs on the hill at the high school (the current middle school). This feat enabled him to 3 free fill ups at Rielly's gas station. Glenn was a Celtics and Red Sox fan. His sports hero was Ted Williams.

The Flanders family left a deep footprint in Windsor Locks. Glenn's father helped found the Windsor Locks Public Library, Glenn's wife and his brother were teachers in Windsor Locks and Glenn selflessly gave his time to various town boards and organizations. If there was a citizen hall of fame Glenn would deserve induction. But for a period of time in the 40's and 50's Glenn put his athletic prowess on display at WLHS and Brown University earning him a place in the Athletic Hall of Fame.



# Meghann Booth



Meghann Booth was an exceptional athlete at WLHS who took her game to the next level while playing for Eastern Connecticut State University. Meghann was a four-year starter in soccer, basketball, and track. As a two-time All-conference selection in track, Meghann ran the 1600, the 400 and was a member of the 4 X 400 relay team. Her junior and senior years she had a double figure scoring average playing small forward for the basketball team. But it was on the soccer field that Meghann excelled, earning all-conference honors three years and an all-state selection her junior and senior years. Meghann was named team captain her senior year. The soccer team finished second in the state tournament.

After graduating from WLHS in 2002, Meghann continued her soccer career at Eastern, being voted second team all-conference in 2003 and 2004. In 2005 she collected more honors by being named First Team All-Conference, being selected to the All-New England team and being invited to play in the Senior Classic.

In 2014 Meghann moved to Nashville Tennessee where she works as a Director of Operations for a video production company called Stage Post. Stage Post produces commercials, training videos and works with live television networks.

Her hobbies include going to her brother's gym, Booth camp, and anything outdoors with her golden retriever Huck. She loves all things sports whether it is a game on TV or in person. She played soccer for many years after college. She has recently shifted to focus on running and strength training. She has run multiple half marathons and is looking to do more in the future. Whenever she gets the chance, she heads back North enjoying spending time with the rest of her family, including her nephew Luke and niece Isla. There have been many fine soccer players that passed through the halls of WLHS over the years, few better or more decorated than Meghann Booth.

# Daniel Farr



Dan Farr was the prototype Dan Sullivan athlete; talented, competitive and always out hustling the opponent. Like his Hall of Fame sister Eileen, Dan was a three sport athlete at Windsor Locks High School. In soccer, he was a four year starter. His senior year he made all-conference and All-State. Playing as a midfielder he was a key member of Coach Sullivan's 5th state soccer championship team in 1990.

In basketball Dan was a three year starter at guard. In his junior year, he was the team's third leading scorer but helped in other ways as well, leading the team in steals, 3 point shots made and tied for assists. His senior year Dan led

the team in scoring, steals, assists, and 3 point baskets made. His most memorable game was against rival Suffield when he scored in double-digits and added 15 rebounds and 9 assists. He was voted all conference in basketball his senior year.

In baseball, Dan was a three year starter, patrolling the outfield and stealing many bases on offense. He also earned all-conference honors in baseball hitting over .400. In 1991 the baseball team was the NCCC champs and reached the semifinals in the state tournament. Danny was selected to play in the baseball senior bowl.

Danny was named team captain in all 3 sports. No matter what sport he played, the Raiders were very competitive. He also excelled in academics earning the scholar athlete award.

After graduating from UConn, Dan married his wife Stacey and they have raised 3 children. Katie, Sophie, and Vinny. His family likes to spend summers in Rhode Island. They like to vacation in the Caribbean as well as visit Disney World. He has coached travel basketball for his children. Dan has a degree in accounting from UConn and an MBA in Finance. He has spent his career in the finance business and currently is the CFO at William Raveis Realty. Whether it was on the field, the court or the diamond, Dan Farr had a will to win that led him into the Athletic Hall of Fame.

# Paul Callahan



Paul Callahan was a true student athlete who not only collected the honors that are awarded for on field performance but was recognized for his equal success in the classroom. Paul played varsity soccer for four years earning all-conference honors three of those years and was selected to the All- State team his senior year. An efficient goal scorer, Paul scored 14 goals his junior season and 12 as a senior, helping him earn a selection to the 1982 Journal Inquirer All Area Team. He culminated his high school soccer career by being named Connecticut Soccer Association Scholar

Athlete of the year. Paul then continued his soccer career at Brown University playing against quality Division 1 competition.

Before leaving WLHS Paul showed his athletic versatility playing varsity basketball and baseball. As a point guard on the basketball team, he selflessly got the ball to his teammates, leading the team in assists his junior and senior years. He was a reliable three-year starter as a pitcher and a shortstop on the baseball team; once collecting 7 assists in one game and tossing a no-hitter for the Locks American Legion team.

Paul presently lives in Acton Massachusetts with his wife Rosemarie and their son Adam who is currently a student at UConn. Paul received a BS in Material Engineering at Brown University and his M.S. at Northeastern University. Paul now works as a principal Hardware Engineer at Dell Technologies. He has published several papers in technical journals on metallurgy, soldering, soldering mechanics, and reliability, and is a co-inventor on several patents. Paul enjoys camping with his friends and family. He has traveled to Germany, Ireland, England, and Japan. He bikes, golfs in a league, and stays active walking his dog Connor. He is a member of the Captains Golf Course in Brewster Massachusetts. Paul's other interest include reading history, playing poker, and preparing BBQ on his smoker.

# 1983 Class M

## Champion 4x400 Relay Team



Competing against larger schools all season steeled the 1983 Windsor Locks High School Four by Four Hundred Relay Team for a run at the State Championship. After beating the likes of Rockville, Windsor, Farmington and South Windsor to capture the CVC Championship, the Raider team was in top form when they arrived at the States. With Billy Johns leading off, followed by Tom Sevigny, Rob LaBreche and Kevin Mockalis at anchor, Windsor Locks bested Terryville in the finals by a comfortable margin. Led by Head Coach Dennis Gagnolati and Assistant Coach John Christopherson the relay team continued the legacy of the great track teams of the Sixties and Seventies at WLHS coached by Pete Sarant. The movie Hoosiers was not released until three years later, but fictional Hickory High had nothing on the 1983 Four by Four Hundred Relay team from Windsor Locks.

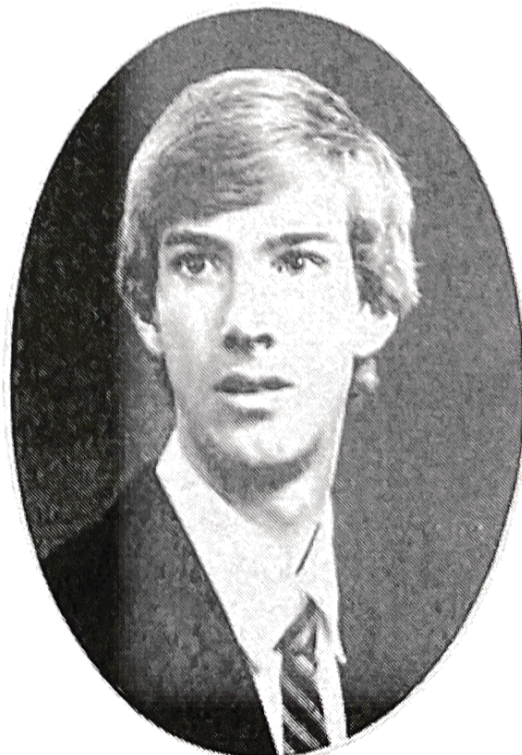


### Billy Johns

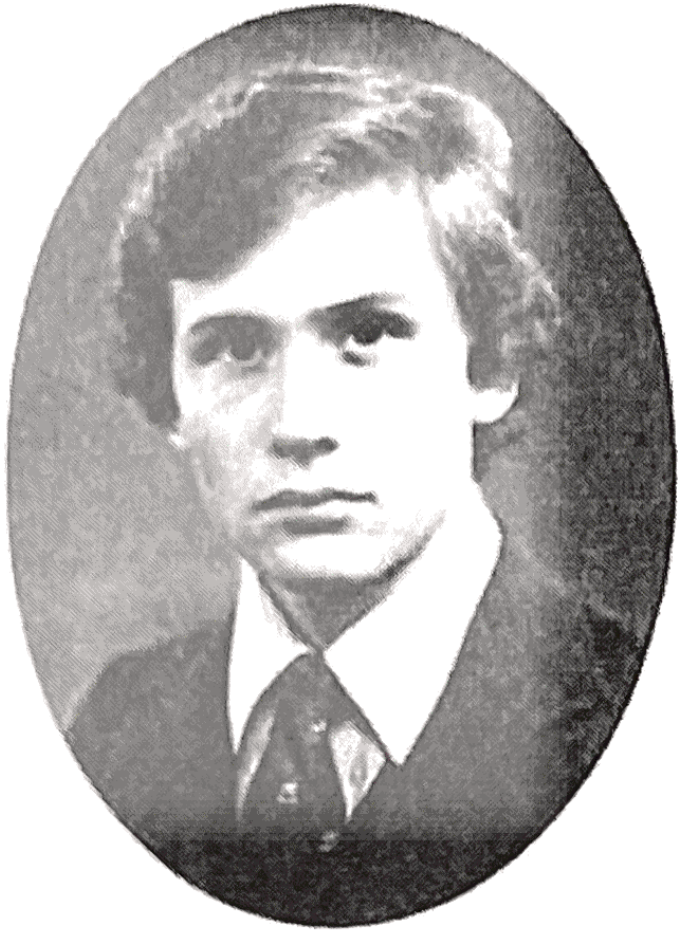
### Rob LaBreche

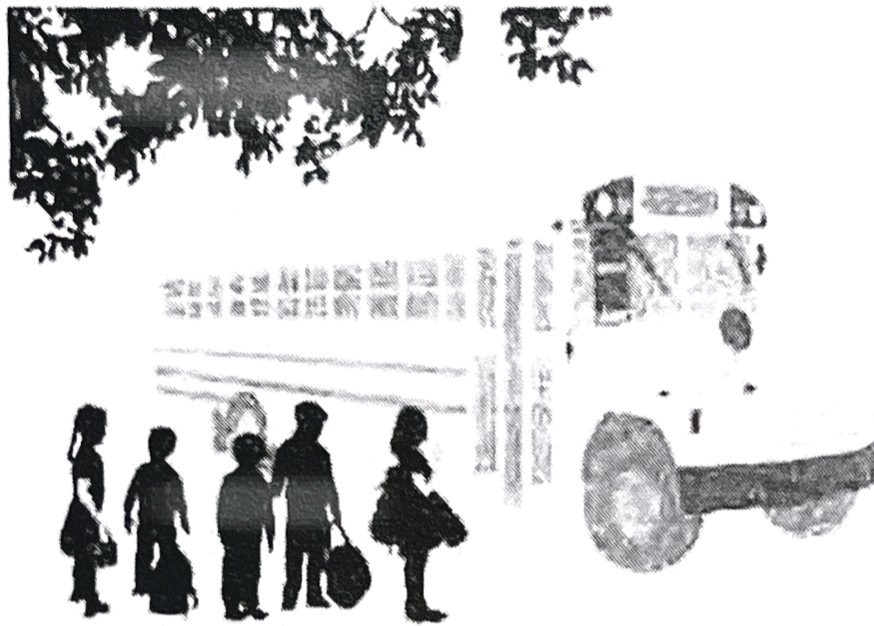
### Tom Sevigny
